

Swimming

Swimming will begin on Monday 15th January for pupils in Year 5 and 6 with an initial block of assessment and development activities. A letter has been shared with parents of pupils in Year 5 and 6 this week with full details. The cost for swimming is expensive to small schools as we have to cover the cost of the coach as well as the cost of the pool and tuition. We are very grateful that this has been *heavily funded by the Friends of the School who have covered just over 50% of the cost*, reducing the price to £4 per session, per pupil.
